Saturday 03/07/10 - Breakfast

For those of you who travel light, there is hot food some two miles from the campsite. Just off the A41 you will find 2 transport cafes, an Indian takeaway + The Raven Hotel. Over the weekend the hotel is open all day, whilst both transport cafes have restricted opening hours. Going the other way, again about two miles, there is the village of Prees.

The Saturday 30 mile ride will leave the campsite at approximately 10.30AM and be split into 2 groups. A "faster" group & yes, a "slower" group. The faster group is to be led by Pat Douglass. Having seen firsthand just how fast Pat can ride, I will definitely be with the "slower" group.

During the ride there will be a stop for coffee & cakes at Wem. About halfway round, a lunch break is scheduled for the picnic area adjacent to the yachting lake at Colemere. *Please be aware: your own sandwiches or other cold food will be required.* When Frank & I visited there some weeks ago, we were disappointed to discover that there were no facilities at Colemere.

The final leg of the ride will be to the Whixall Triangle. As an aid to travel through this area, Val & Frank used yellow arrows where necessary. By the way, the distance between Colemere & Prees is roughly 12 miles.

After the main Saturday ride there is a Cake Competition, so get baking or perhaps buy a cake before you arrive?
